IMPORTANT SCHOOL CALENDAR CHANGES FOR 2017/18:

At yesterday's Board of Education meeting, the Board of Education approved the following:

- · President's Day is no longer an inclement weather make-up day and will remain a day off of school.
- May 18 is now a school-day, as a half-day for students and half-day for school-based professional learning (articulation activities).
- · April 4, 5 and 6 are also now full days of school.
- · Spring Break will be Friday, March 30-Tuesday, April 3.
- · If there is another inclement weather day off of school this year, June 15 will be the make-up student day.
 - o Note that no final exams or end-of-the-year promotion ceremonies may be scheduled on June 15, as June 15 is Eid al-Fitr.

Due to the fact that we have missed 4 B days and had an additional shortened B day for unscheduled early dismissal as of February 7, 2018, the county has made some adjustments and updates to the A Day/B Day calendar for the remainder of this school year:

- Tuesday, February 20 will be changed from an A Day to a B Day.
- Wednesday, April 4 will be a B Day.
- Thursday, April 5 will be an A Day.
- Friday, April 6 will be a B Day.
- Friday, May 18 will be a B Day.
- If Friday, June 15 is used as an inclement weather make-up day, it will be a B Day.

"INNOCENCE STOLEN: PROTECTING OUR CHILDREN"

Presented by Vincent DeVivo from the U.S. Attorney's Office, on March 8, 2018,6:30–8:00 PM at Lime Kiln Middle School. "Innocence Stolen: Protecting Our Children Online" reviews the array of threats teenagers face when they go online.

This multimedia presentation is designed to equip and empower parents and guardians to address the teachable moments that occur when accessing the Internet. The presentation speaks directly to adults. We offer the opportunity for you to bring your teenager in order to promote conversations within families about the dangers online; however, please be advised of the mature content of the presentation. Discussion topics will include social networking, cyber bullying, sexting, and Internet predators. "FIGHT THE FLU" - Preventing Flu, Flu-like illness and GI Virus illnesses:

As you know, our region is experiencing one of the worst flu seasons in many years. Here are some recommendations from the Health Department to help prevent the spread of illness:

- Avoid close contact with infected persons. Children who are unwell should stay at home.
- Wash hands frequently with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially before and after eating, after using the bathroom, after episodes of vomiting or diarrhea, whenever visibly soiled.
- If soap and water is unavailable, hand sanitizers may be used. Rub sanitizer over all hand surfaces until the sanitizer has dried, then wash with soap and water when possible.
- Teach proper cough hygiene. Transmission is possible through close contact with an infected person.
- Avoid putting fingers in the nose, mouth or rubbing the eyes. Transmission through mucus membranes after touching contaminated objects is possible.
- Students should not return to school until they have been symptom free for 24 hours. Do not send a child back to school until they have been fever free for 24 hours without the aid of fever-reducing medication. Students with a confirmed lab diagnosis of norovirus should not return to school until they have been symptom free for 48 hours.
